


How to take a MAP test

1. Website for MAP testing is always: **test.mapnwea.org**
2. A test window should appear that looks like below

If an **“Oops! Where’s my test window”** message appears, refresh the page first and if message remains then you could have a pop-up blocker active on your browser. Please find blocker controls and set them to always allow pop-ups for mapnwea.org.

3. Session Name and Session Password information available day of test on **mygovs.com** website. News section.

5. Click inside the top box and start typing your name. Select your name from the dropdown list.

6. It is important to select the correct tests. We only use two tests: **Growth: Read 6+** and **Growth: Math 6+**

7. Please avoid an **invalid test** result by not selecting answers rapidly. NWEA software detects what they call a “disengaged student” alert. This often gets flashed on the proctor’s session screen and the proctor should then **pause** your test. This is to send you a message to slow down your answer selections. If you continue, NWEA software may suspend your test or if you continue rapid guessing to the end you will get an invalid test result screen at the end, and we will be asking you to take the test again.
8. If your test session ends unexpectedly, this may be a technical glitch. Usually this is not something a proctor is aware of. Please call the **help number** to get the proctor to reset your test, which only takes about 20 seconds for the proctor to do. If that doesn’t happen and you have to test again for any reason. NWEA remembers and saves your test progress, so the new session will pick up where the old session ended.
